Autumn Term	Changes in Britain for the Stone Age to the Iron Age		Y3 children to have their introduction to the history of Britain. Y4 children have had knowledge of British history from the previous year. This is an introduction to the first civilisations in Britain.

Summer Term	The achievements of the earliest civilizations – an overview of where and when the first civilizations appeared and a depth study of Ancient Egypt		First civilisations – to link with the previous history unit where they learnt about the first civilisations in British history. Children will build on their knowledge of the first civilisations (from lower school) and apply this to their knowledge of world history.

Autumn Term	WW2 – study or aspect or theme in British History that extends pupils’ chronological knowledge beyond 1066 (a significant turning point in British history)		British history has been taught in the lower school. Children have had an introduction to world history from the study of Ancient Egypt.
Spring Term	A non-European society that provides contrasts with British history – from Mayan civilization c. AD 900		Children have learnt about British history and ancient societies in the previous unit. Children will be covering the Amazon and Americas which will link with Maya. Children will be able to discuss the contrast of British history as they have studied the history of Britain in previous learning.
Summer Term	Ancient Greece – a study of Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world		Children will have learnt about ancient civilisations. They can use this knowledge to look at Ancient Greece. Children will have learnt about the Geography of Greece and Europe. This can then help them to think about the location of Greece and the history of it.
